This issue of *Quality Assurance and Safety of Crops & Foods* will focus on assuring the reliability of analytical results concerning positive quality aspects such as organic production practices and freshness indicators, but also safety related concerns such as mycotoxins, pathogenic microorganisms, certain food additives or gluten in special dietetic foods for coeliac patients. The diversity of food quality and safety aspects and the variety of foods touched upon in this issue reflect well the focus and scope of *Quality Assurance and Safety of Crops & Foods*. As an introduction to Wageningen Academic Publishers all papers of this issue are also available as open access.
